LEAVES & LIMBS

As you begin to trim your trees and rake leaves this fall, the Public Works Department would like to remind you about the City wide limb & leaf removal services. Limb removal is available curbside on Fridays throughout the year. Limbs and trees are required to be no longer than six feet and smaller than 6 inches in diameter. Please stack all items at the curb or road side for pickup and avoid placing these items under power lines or near other obstructions for ease of service. Crews now utilize a claw truck to pick up limbs so please place your piles in a clear open area for pickup. Leaf service is also available year round and can be picked up in CLEAR PLASTIC BAGS on Fridays. Clear bags are available for sale at City Hall. You may also elect to rake your leaves to the Curbside from November to February to take advantage of the Cities Leaf Vacuum Service. As a reminder please do not block the sidewalk or drainage ditches with your leaves.
